The programme works in close cooperation with partners, building on and strengthening their resilience, sustainability, knowledge and expertise. Based in Chiang Mai, Thailand, the POM will play a critical role in ensuring the effective implementation and financial integrity of the programme.

Who we are

International Media Support (IMS) supports local independent media and media advocacy groups in countries affected by conflict, political transition, and authoritarian rule. Since 2001, IMS has worked with hundreds of local and international partners to support independent journalism, freedom of expression and the safety of journalists.

Job summary

The **Programme Operations Manager** will be responsible for overseeing operational and financial aspects of the Myanmar programme, ensuring seamless coordination and compliance with donor requirements. This position involves close collaboration with our finance team at IMS headquarters in Copenhagen, and occasional travel to Denmark should be anticipated. Additionally, the role may over time expand to include regional responsibilities across our programmes in Southeast Asia, depending on funding opportunities and IMS's future regional set-up.

Key functions and key responsibilities

Financial management and reporting

- Oversee the operational support and financial management of the Myanmar programme, ensuring efficient budget controls and compliance with donor guidelines.
- Collaborate closely with IMS HQ finance colleagues in Copenhagen, ensuring accurate financial reporting and alignment with organizational standards.

- Explore opportunities for regional involvement in IMS programmes across Southeast Asia, expanding the scope of the role based on emerging funding opportunities.
- Provide leadership and operational guidance across multiple programmes, driving consistency and excellence in financial management

Qualifications and skills

- Bachelor's degree in finance or a related field; CPA or equivalent certification is an advantage.
- A minimum of 7 years of experience in financial and operational management, ideally within an international NGO setting. Experience with EU grants is an advantage.
- Strong collaboration and communication skills, with experience working with headquarters teams in different locations.
- Demonstrated ability to manage complex budgets and ensure compliance with donor requirements.
- Experience in regional programme management and the ability to adapt to evolving responsibilities.
- Proactive, solution-oriented, and flexible, with a strong commitment to achieving programme goals.
- Fluency in written and spoken English is required. Fluency in Thai language will be an advantage.

IMS was established in 2001 in the wake of the tragic events in Rwanda and the former Yugoslavia where these and other conflicts saw media being manipulated and used as a tool to fuel violent conflict. IMS was set up in response to this trend with the aim to help local media working in conflict-affected areas to remain operative and professional.

We support the production and distribution of media content that meets internationally recognised ethical standards and work to ensure safe media environments with sound laws for journalists. We do this because citizens and leaders need information they can trust to make decisions that develop their societies in a peaceful and democratic way.

The organisation is headed by Jesper Højberg Executive Director of IMS. Our headquarters are based in Copenhagen with field offices currently in Ethiopia, Tunisia, Kenya/Somalia, Thailand/Myanmar, Niger and Pakistan.
